Thoughts From Your Lay Leader

The Accessibility Improvement Project has made great progress in the last few weeks. First, an informational meeting was held after church services on March 17th, led by Natasha Mitchner, Jim Enloe and Jay Messaros, to explain to interested congregants the two options being considered for improving church accessibility. Recommendations and suggestions were collected from the participants at this meeting. Then, based on this feedback, our Lead Team approved the selection of Option 2, the Hadley Road entry option, at our Lead Team meeting on April 16th. In addition, two of the Accessibility Team members (Jim Enloe and Linda Scoglietti) travelled to Cincinnati to check out two of the chairlift equipment manufacturers and try them out. They recommended selecting one of the manufacturers, Bruno, based on comfort, sturdiness and safety features.

Your trustee Chair, Jay Messaros, has met with the City of Kettering regarding permits, and has been working with an Architect to supply Code Compliant drawings of the ramp system required to obtain these permits. Jay has also developed an approximate cost for the Phase 2 Option, and is estimated to be between \$80,000 and \$100,000 to complete the project.

Although we currently have a small Grant (\$7000), thanks to Natasha Mitchner, to start this project, we will need additional funding to complete it, and the Lead Team is in the process of initiating a Capital Campaign to provide the necessary funds. The exact nature of this campaign hasn't yet been defined, but we will ultimately be requesting pledges from you, the congregation, over a time period yet to be determined.

Please be thinking about how you may be able to help financially in achieving this sorely needed accessibility improvement capability. Pray about it, keeping in mind that improving accessibility helps attract those who would like to come but can't attend because of the limited accessibility we now have. More information is forthcoming, so stay tuned.

The symbolism of the acolytes lighting the candles on the altar?

The light is carried into the worship service as a symbol of Jesus' coming into the presence of the worshiping community. Many congregations use two candles on the altar to point out that Jesus was both a human being and God. At the end of the service, the light is carried out into the world to show that Jesus Christ is for all people everywhere; The acolyte leaves the worship service, carrying out the lighted candlelighter. This symbolizes the light of Jesus Christ going out into the world where believers are to serve.
